The highest award of Utah Association of the Deaf (UAD) known is known as “Golden Hand Award.” This award honors people or organizations for their extraordinary work or accomplishment. This award is decided by the Golden Hand Committee after receiving nominations from the Utah Deaf community. Moreover, the Golden Hand Award is presented biennially to an individual or organization that has substantially contributed to the betterment the Deaf community in Utah.

Historically, Golden Hand Award was started by National Association of the Deaf. They have encouraged state associations to set up a state Golden Hand Award. UAD did not set it up until 1979, as listed below.

The criteria of Golden Hand Award are:

- Any individual or organization that has made a substantial contribution to the improvement of the Utah deaf community may be nominated.
- Individuals must not have received pay for the volunteer work. Organizations must not have paid individuals to do volunteer work.
- Programs under an agency with a paid staff may be nominated, but the extent of salaried activities must be clearly indicated on the nomination statement.
- Volunteer activities must have been performed within the state of Utah.
- Screening committee members may not submit nominations.
- Individuals and groups may submit as many separate nominations as desired.

After going through the hard copy of UAD Bulletins, I have listed of names that have received their Golden Hand Award. However, please be cautioned that some of the name may be missing. Once our UAD Bulletins are digitized and posted to website archives, I should be able to find accuracy of data. As of now, I've put the names/years together the best I could. So, enjoy!
